## **Tobacco-Free Campus**

While smoking is prohibited in all buildings, there is no current policy/protocol in place for a tobacco-free campus.

c. Describe recommended policy/protocol change, and the benefit/impact:

Policy/Protocol: "The use of tobacco products (as defined by the Food and Drug Administration) is prohibited anywhere on the Springfield Technical Community College Campus. This policy includes chewing tobacco, electronic and vapor cigarettes, and applies to students, staff, faculty, contractors, and visitors."



d. Describe background and rational for how the recommendation was generated (involvement of staff-faculty-students-governance bodies), include any supporting data, reports, survey results, research, et al.:

## Fall 2020

The Smoke Free Campus Work Group was developed in Fall 2020 to research if and how STCC could develop a plan for a smoke-free campus. Members of the committee represented constituencies from across campus. The Work Group researched and discussed feasibility, policy, rationale, legality, cessation sources, signage, and grant opportunities.

#### Spring 2021

On May 25, 2021, a Tobacco Use on Campus Survey was sent out to all students registered for spring 2021 and fall 2021, STCC's Campus Community distribution list, and entities that operate and/or share campus grounds with the college. The roll up across all demographics was 65% in favor and 35% not in favor.

#### Fall 2023

The AUC Physical Campus and Budget Committee decided to investigate the possibility of passing a tobacco-free campus policy. In our discussions, we discussed the pros:

- Reduce use of tobacco use among faculty, staff, and visitors to the college
- Eliminate second hand smoke
- Create an opportunity to educate students about tobacco
- Prepare students for smoke and tobacco free workplaces
- Reduce litter (Worldwide, there are 4.5 trillion cigarette butts littered each year, <u>WHO</u>)

The AUC Physical Campus and Budget Committee discussed possible issues that might arise. Our committee does not currently have solutions to these issues:

- Enforcement of the policy
- How to address shared property with the Springfield Armory National Historic Site
- How to roll out the policy
- Whether or not to create smoking areas on campus

We decided to bring the question before the body in the next AUC General Assembly.

#### AUC General Assembly on September 20, 2023

The question, "Do you think the AUC Budget & Facilities Committee should move forward a proposal to become a Smoke Free campus" was asked via Zoom poll. The results were:

79% Yes 15% No



### 6% Abstain

While the populations polled in 2021 and 2023 are slightly different, the numbers show a significant rise in our community's desire to pass a tobacco-free campus policy.

The AUC Physical Campus and Budget Committee and the Smoke Free Campus Work Group found, compiled or developed a few resources that may be helpful if we move forward with this initiative:
