

COVID-19 Campus Repopulating Work Group Minutes

October 6, 2020

Discussion Points

- Jenkin Gould noted that the check-in process continues to go well. One incident occurred recently when a visitor became confrontational when they were denied access to campus. The incident was handled well and the individual received a no trespass notice.
- Jonathan Miller noted that it is necessary for Health Services to have a means of communication with Tech Park. IT is currently working with Collins Electric to install a data drop. CARES Act funding will cover the cost of this data drop.
- A link has been established which will allow individuals to choose a COVID testing time slot. This will be forwarded to Health Services who will follow up with the individual via email. Confirmed testing names will be added to the B17 check-in sheet.
- Barbara Washburn noted that she was tested last Wednesday and did not receive her result until she emailed AMR today. Lisa Fugiel also noted that this has been an issue. Students are not receiving results in a timely manner or not receiving results at all. Jonathan Miller suggested that student results sent to Health Services should be uploaded to Colleague.
- Lisa Fugiel presented a testing option to the group for review. She suggested testing on Saturday. In this case, if the student was asymptomatic and tested positive on a Saturday when there were no labs - only the student has to quarantine. This would eliminate many phone calls and readjust their educational plan. The only problem with this is timing. The results would need to be back by Monday as the majority of students attend clinical Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Lisa's plan also suggested setting up testing with AMR in either Lot 1 or 2 (drive up option). Students can be pre-registered and Patrick/staff would already have the list of students and info. The drive up option would also allow students to be tested who have symptoms. Presently, if students have symptoms they are being told to go elsewhere as they cannot be on campus. Testing done off campus would save time and effort – no campus access issue, etc. KC Senie noted that she is very hesitant to move testing off campus. Saturday testing may be an option – possible drive through in either Lot 1 or 2.
 - Would a detail officer be needed if testing was done in our lot?
 - How would we keep the general public away from outside lot?
 - KC will speak with Dr. Cook and get back to the group
- The issue of student parking on campus was discussed. The group would like to see any student with a class after 3:00 allowed to park on campus immediately.
