Springfield Technical Community College's (STCC) partnership with Cambridge College (CC) enables Associate in Science in Criminal Justice (LECJ.AS) graduates to transfer up to 81 STCC credits toward a Cambridge College Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice.

The primary purpose of Cambridge College's program partnership with Springfield Technical Community College is to maximize the number of transferable credits, and facilitate ease of enrollment between our two institutions.

This program partnership is designed to maximize the students' educational experience and earned credits in the following ways:

- Cambridge College provides graduates of Springfield Technical Community College Associate in Science in Criminal Justice (LECJ.AS) guaranteed admission into its Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice program.
- Cambridge College accepts, *in total*, all credits constituting the Springfield Technical Community College Associate in Science in Criminal Justice (LECJ.AS) (60 credits).
- Cambridge College permits Springfield Technical Community College AS in Criminal Justice (LECJ.AS) students to take an additional seven (7) 3-credit courses above and beyond the credits applied to their Associate's degree, for a total of up to 81 transferable credits. These additional STCC courses are identified in green in the table below, and must be completed at a grade of 2.0 or higher for inclusion in this program.

In order to continue providing students with the best possible opportunities to further their education, Springfield Technical Community College and Cambridge College are committed to creating program partnerships that will insure that all students have the opportunity to continue to advance and excel.

This agreement shall remain in effect for a period of five years from the date listed below, with the provision that the terms specified herein will continue to apply to students admitted from Springfield Technical Community College's AS in Criminal Justice (LECJ.AS) degree within one year of the expiration of the agreement. Each institution agrees to provide timely notice to the other in the event of any modification to the curriculum that might affect compatibility for admission and transfer of coursework. This agreement may be subject to change, with notification, if curriculum requirements change at either institution. Students admitted to the Springfield Technical Community College's AS in Criminal Justice (LECJ.AS) degree program prior to such notification shall be admitted to Cambridge College on the basis of this agreement. This agreement is conditional upon the Criminal Justice

Department at STCC and the Justice Studies Department at Cambridge College maintaining program approval from the Massachusetts Board of Higher Education.






